Surveyed for David B. Carpenter. Beginning at the S.E. corner
of section 36 Town 5 Range 14 a white oak 4' 6" W 5 links distant
11 inches in diameter, a white oak 8' 2" W 10 links dist. 10 inches in
diameter, thence west 40 chains and set a stake, continued to the
S.W. corner of said section in a prairie, thence South 80 chains
to the S.W. corner of said sec a white oak 11 inches in diameter
4' 6" 24 links dist. in 80th W 50 links dist. thence east 40 chains
set a stake in the edge of a mill pond, continued 80 chains to the
S.E. corner a white oak 17 inches diam. 4' 3" 6' 34 links dist., the bearing
now at the latter stake are a black oak 18 inches diam. 4' 3" 10'
39 links dist a white oak 30 in. diam. 4' 3" 8' 66 links dist, from
this corner 40 chains set a stake continued 80 ch. to the stake
set in the first line, returned to the stake in the centre a white
oak 21 inches diam with 8 links dist thence
east 40 chains and curved in the east
line of the sec. an elm divided into 3
trunks 6' 6" 3' 30 links dist. thence South
to the S.E. corner of said sec. to es-
tablish the corners of the fourth east quar-
ter of sec 36 Town 5 Range 14 E of the G-
oldenrod — Then being N^o westerly var-
iation from the original courses.

Surveyed for Jeptha Garwood; Beginning at two sugar trees and
a beech cr 75° W 141 poles from the north east corner of James Cal-
derwoods land and the river cr 3137 and S.E. corner to said
Calderwoods survey cr 3137; thence cr 75° W 160 poles to a stone in the
landowner's road, with trees a sugar tree 6' 6" 17 links west, a beech
cr 75° E 60 links (crossed the sugar camp branch 90 poles from the beginning and the
river at 62 poles) thence cr 75° E with said road crossing the river at
80 poles 120 poles to two bushes on said road, thence cr 75° E (crossing
a spring branch at 10 poles, the sugar camp branch at 190 poles & 230 poles to

a sycamore and buck hedges
thence south 34 poles to a
Walnut and Lynn thence
S 43° 24' W 70 poles to 2 hickories
and a beech; thence S 13° W
25 poles to the beginning
containing one hundred
and fifty three acres
6 degrees easterly variation
from the original line.

Surveyed for Nicholas Stillwell Sen. Beginning at a stake in a
line of said Stillwell's land on the bank of a branch south of John House
where I caused a stone to be put; thence N 68° W up said branch 40 poles to
a stake in a meadow on the bank of said branch; thence S 85° W crossing
said branch at 2 poles 20 poles to 2 small elms; thence N 10° E 12 poles to
2 elms on the banks of said branch, one on this,
and one on that side; thence S 55° E 24 poles
to a Lynn and blue ash; thence S 15° E 6 poles
to a beech; thence S 55° E 10 poles to an ironwood
and dogwood; thence N 14° W 46 poles to the begin
ning containing 10 acres up.

Surveyed for Martin Harmon Beginning at 2 buck eye stamps
and a black berry stamp in the burying ground of the Society of
Friends at Goshen it being the north westerly corner of Samuel
Davis' survey no 3216 and easterly corner to Duncan McArthur's
survey no 4413 and is on the old Indian trace which leads from
Isaac Zani's place on Mad River to the head of Darby's Branch, where
I caused a stone to be placed, which bears N 78° W 15.8 poles from the corner
thence N 15° W allowing 3 degrees variation westly from the original
