

Allinger Survey.

The following described land in Fractional Section 24, Town 3, Range 13 of between the Miami River's Survey and being in the Village of Quincy, Niami Township, Logan County, Ohio.

Beginning at an iron (part of R.R. Rail on end) at N.E. corner of Lot No.1 oforiginal town of Quincy; thence N.1°55' E. 16 feet to the North side of an alley; thence N.88° 05' E. 16 feet to E.J. Cox's S.E. corner: thence with said Cox's East line and the East line of Allinger track N.1° 55' E. 608 feet to a concrete post at the East end of a hedge fence near a mill race the last described line passing Cox's N.E. corner and Allinger's S.E. corner at 375 feet: thence East 87 feet to a stake, said stake being the beginning point of this survey: thence East 144.0 feet to a concrete post: thence N.22° O' E. 95.0 feet to a concrete post at South side of The Great Miami River; thence with the South edge of said river N.65° W. 39 feet; N.88° W. 47 feet; thence with the South edge of the water in head of Mill Race S.48° 15' W. 114 feet to a stake; thence S.17°E.20 feet; S.57°45' W. 22 feet to the place of beginning, said tract containing 0.30 of one acre more or less and being the same tract as surveyed August 7,1935 as shown in Logan County Surveyor's Book 584, Pages 61 to 66.



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
