8376 of said Roger's lot of land, thence S 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  E 104 pole, crossing a large  
branch at 86 pole, to 3 sugar trees of them now cut down. thence S 78 $\frac{1}{2}$   
E 100 pole, crossing a small race at 38 pole. Creek at 52 pole, and  
small race at 81 pole, to 2 beeches, now cut down, thence N 19 $\frac{1}{2}$  W.  
104 pole, crossing Creek at 82 pole, to 2 Hickory trees, thence

25 Links, and White Oak 10 in. 181  $\frac{1}{2}$  & 59 Links - thence N 89 $\frac{1}{2}$  W 40 pole  
50 Links, to a Hickory 8 in. dia 532 & 22 Link, Elm 8 in. dia 525 E 342  
thence N 2 E 50 chain to a stake in a prairie, thence N 88 $\frac{1}{2}$  E 342  
51 Link to the beginning containing 116  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre. Also
